### Letter from our President

Tashi Delek (greeting in Tibetan),

It has been over 10 years since my Yuko and I joined some passionate friends and started Education at Elevation. I've been blessed to be part of this organization. Providing education for children in addition to food and shelter. It has been such a joy to see the changes in children's faces after their enrollment in the school. They smile a lot, look generally happier, and more peaceful and confident. We have graduated more than sixty students and currently support thirty-two with basic reading, writing and arithmetic. Some of the graduates moved to a city for a new job or to continue their education - which they had never thought about before going to school.

We happily continue our support in providing scholarships to two college female students every year through the Tibetan Village Project.

Education at Elevation had just two fund raising efforts this past year: a winter holiday cookie drive, and our Tibetan meditation day in Bothell, Washington.

We are sponsoring a new classroom within a bigger school next to the original school. Local seniors are planned to move into the existing school. There will be a pathway between these buildings, so elders and children can go back and forth. In this way, building community will have a place to gather, study, eat and sleep.

All this has been possible because of your continuous support. Your contributions go to basic needs such as food, clothes, and teacher salaries. The resources you provide also brought special projects into fruition, including construction of the first school and a much needed water system. You have made it possible for these children to dream and hope for new opportunities. Thank you for believing in and supporting our students for 10 years!

#### At the Nga Gyur She Dup Cho Ling School, we have provided:

- 12 months of food for 33 kids and teachers
- Supply of winter coats for all 33 students and teachers
- One-year salary for 2 teachers
- 6-month salary for school's chef
- \$5,000 towards the new school building construction (with remaining \$5,000 to be paid in 2018-19)





