New Life Begins Here

Gaga, 9 years old, my typical life at the school “Nga Gyur Shed Dup Choe Ling”:

9 — 9:30 am Well blessing player (and dedicate to all who helped the project)
9:30 am—12:30 pm Morning class
12:30 —3 pm Lunch and break
3—6 pm Afternoon class
6—7 pm Dinner
7—9 pm Evening class

We were surprised to learn the children studied in late evening. All children wanted was to stay warm by gathering in front of the big stove in the



classroom. The Teacher takes the opportunity to teach them at the same time.

The Tibetan plateau is very cold starting in early Fall. The school enrolled the students in September before the first chill hit the area. The school was barely ready at that moment. Only the student's quarters, the Teacher's Rooms, and a Classroom was ready. The school needs a kitchen and toilets which are planned for in 2009 if funding is sufficient.

Thunten is 13 years old, He likes to study and wishes to become a teacher for rural children. Also for fun he rides yaks and sings songs when reaching the top of a hill or mountain. Thunten really enjoys school and work very hard to do well.



Ngaga a 12 years old boy who likes to play with dogs and “voe” a small yak. His warm heart towards animals encourages and promotes his care of the “voe” and the ill yaks. At times, Ngaga often sleep with the animals. He also loves horseback riding and drinks butter tea.

The total number of children enrolled in the school “Nga Gyur Shed Dup Choe Ling” is 63. The school quickly reached full capacity. Currently there are 2 teachers and one of them has earned the title of Khenpo (equivalent to PhD

in Buddhism Philosophy). Similar to the Montessori school system here, the classroom has students from different ages too. No matter if the students are 6 or 14 years old, all of them are learning Tibetan languages for the first time in their lives.

Tibetan diet: The typical meals served here are mainly butter tea, rice, tsampa (barley flour), noodle with little yak meat. Potatoes are only available in summer because it become too cold in winter. Many items have froze during transport. The vegetable too only available from low land in summer.
